

Forward Together Reconciling Sunday School Class

Sunday, October 26, 2025, was a historic day for Bethany UMC. Forward Together Reconcil ng Sunday School Class sponsored a congregational straw poll vote to gauge the interest of the Bethany UMC family toward moving forward to be a more affirming, accepting and inclusive church by becoming a reconciling congregation/church. This journey started in 2018 when a group got together, under the direction of Rev Julia Webb-Bowden, to discuss and reflect on the United Methodist Church's 2016 Study of the Council of Bishops Commission on the Way Forward. 23 Bethany family members participated.

After the completion of the eight-week study, a smaller spin-off group decided to continue working toward Bethany being a more inclusive church. After several meetings the group went through the 5 step process and unanimously voted to affiliate with The Reconciling Ministries Network, and Forward Together Reconciling Group was born.

After COVID and Bethany opened up for regular churches services again, a handful of the original Forward Together Reconciling Group decided to become more active within Bethany to be a more affirming, accepting and inclusive church, and with permission from the Bethany Church Council, on June 2023, the Forward Together Reconciling Sunday Class was born.

Since then, they have completed book studies, video series, and became involved in outside mission opportunities, demonstrating the dignity, love, acceptance and affirmation afforded to any beloved child of God.

After hosting a joint video series with the Lizzie Grey Sunday School Class "Faithful and Inclusive – The Bible, Sexuality and the United Methodist Church" by Rev Rob Fuquay, Forward Together Reconciling Sunday School Class discussed their desire to petition the Bethany UMC Church Council to provide a Bethany church wide vote to affiliate with The Reconciling Ministries Network and become a Reconciling Church and expand the simple sense of welcome and belonging of ALL people into the Bethany United Methodist family.

85% of the Bethany UM Church family voted to continue with the journey to be a more affirming, accepting and inclusive church by affiliating with the Reconciling Ministries Network and becoming a Reconciling congregation/church.

Forward Together Reconciling Sunday School class wishes to thank all that voted to move forward to becoming a reconciling congregation/church and offers the opportunity to answer any questions or address any concerns to those who voted no.

Dear Bethany Church Family,

The author of Hebrews writes that, "faith is the assurance [or reality] of things hoped for, the conviction [or evidence] of things not seen" (Heb. 11:1, NRSVUE). Faith is central to our walk with Christ as disciples. It is faith, given by God in grace, that allows us to build a relationship with God, to embody God's will with humility, to transform into Christ-likeness, to know God and to encounter God's Spirit. Faith is the avenue, the byway, for a fallen humanity to encounter and work in relationship with a righteous God. But how can we be sure of this faith? What assurance do we have that this faith is true and how can we be confident in it? Truthfully, that is a difficult question to answer. How can we be sure of something that is unseen?

The 21st century ushered in a new age of technology, scientific discoveries and empirical thought. We are a people of progression, advancing to the next level of technological and scientific toys, instru-

ments, tools, innovations and studies. I think this is one of the amazing things about the humanity that God created. We ourselves are creators and innovators. We learn from past leaders, researchers, scholars, everyday people and historians. We build off of the legacy that they left us and make it our own. We test something and when it doesn't work, we, usually, try to do something different and make it better. We do repeat the mistakes of the past, but we also learn from it. We have come to an enlightenment period where facts, figures, studies, and evidence trump everything else. I think that these studies of logic, science and reason are good things that help us in building a world that causes human flourishing and abundance. And I do place a certain trust in these things and see them as good when used in appropriate ways.

The only problem that I see is that people will often only see value and surety in the physical, seen world. We naturally will disregard the ideas, thoughts and spirit that linger outside of what the physical senses (touch, taste, sight, smell, hearing) can experience. We will naturally trust in the surety of a bologna sandwich on a plate and being able to eat it compared to a spiritual experience walking along the beach during a tumultuous time. The bologna sandwich *seems more real* than the spiritual experience because of the observational fact that it is there and yet the spiritual experience *feels more real* than any other experience we have had in our whole entire life. I think that we as humans are sure of our immediate surroundings and yet we yearn for what is outside of ourselves and our immediate physical senses. We yearn for something that takes us deeper into life's meaning and that takes us beyond the observation of facts and figures. It is not just observing the world but deciding what to do in it. What do we do with our history, our research, our studies, our possessions, our world and our lives?

This is where the rubber meets the road. Where does our confidence in decision making come from? Is it within ourselves? Is it about making ourselves the most comfortable by obtaining as much as we can? Or is life more than survival? We are the result of our genetics, our upbringing, our personal experiences, our social groups and our interests. But what do we do with this bundle of things that is connected through the tissue of, what we call, a human being? That is the question that God implanted in each of us. God is seeking to work together with us to achieve God's good will for the world that brings all to be fed, quenched, served, forgiven and saved. Yet God does not necessarily come to us in our observation of a bologna sandwich (yet God could if God wanted to) but in the process, or movement, of what we can do with that bologna sandwich to love God and neighbor. When God's Spirit meets ours, we gain a view from the heavenly places and no longer is the world filled with mechanical differences, but we find God in everything and everyone. We experience the vastness of God's grace by allowing the mystery of the divine to flood the world of the concrete and observable. What is white becomes black and our worldview is flipped upside down. Assurance is finding that God is found in every place. Faith is, "the conviction of things not seen." Assurance is finding God in things seen and unseen. Assurance is found in the divine mystery of the bologna sandwich and the walk on the beach. Assurance is found and deepens our understanding of God through faith. Faith allows us to have assurance in God, but it is we who work with God to build the muscles that allow surety to grow.




